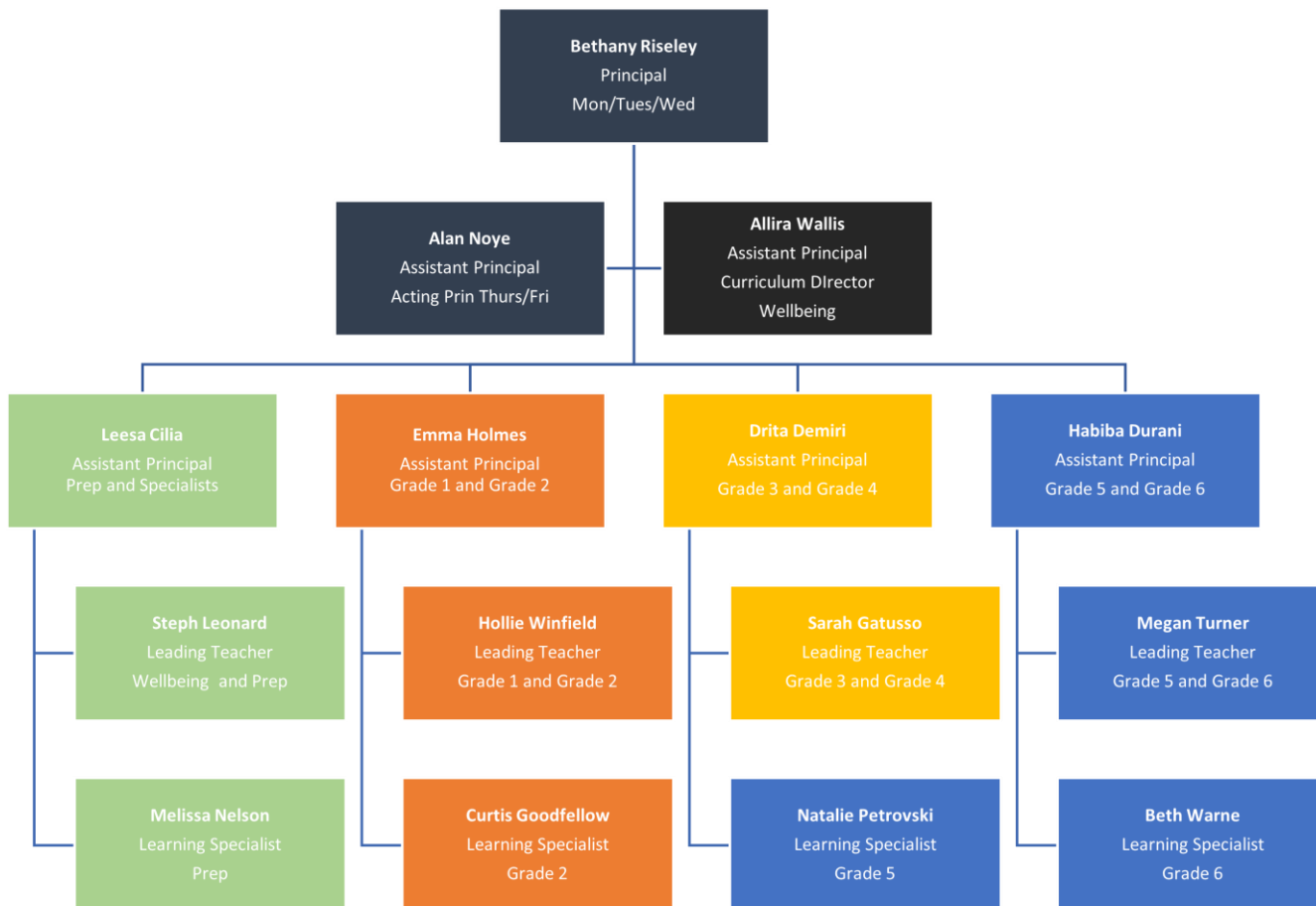
I am looking forward to an exciting year, I hope 2023 brings great things for you and your family.

What happened at school over the holidays?

You would have noticed that the front of our school has been painted over the holidays, this was a big shock to lots of teachers and students as they came to school on the first day as it is very different from the previous yellow. Over the holidays, the toilet block outside the learning lab was refurbished with new lino and paint. Swimming 2023

We are excited that our swimming program will be recommencing on Monday 13th February, swimming is an important part of our curriculum. This term our Grade 3-6 students will swim and next term Prep-2. At the end of the term, Kingswim will host a showcase where parents are invited to come and watch their child swim and see their progress throughout the term so stay tuned for that info later in the term. All students should be participating in their weekly swimming lesson, however, this year Grade 3-6 students who are not swimming on a particular day for an approved reason will be completing a 'dry program' booklet that will focus on water safety. Students will work in another classroom to complete this while their class is swimming at the pool.

2023 School Council Notice of Election/Call for Nominations

All government schools in Victoria have a school council. They are legally constituted bodies that are given powers to set the key directions of a school within state-wide guidelines. In doing this, a school council is able to directly influence the quality of education that the school provides for its students.

We currently have 3 available positions in our parent member category. Parents on school councils provide important viewpoints and have valuable skills that can help shape the direction of our school. This position will be for the 2023 and 2024 school years.

Nomination forms may be obtained from the school and must be lodged by Friday 10th of February 2023 by 4:00pm. A list of candidates and nominators will be shared on Wednesday 15th February after which, ballot papers for all parents will be prepared and distributed so that our community can vote for the parent members they would like to see on School Council. This ballot will close on Friday the 24th of February at 4:00pm and the votes will be counted on Monday the 27th of February 2023.

There is a display in our office area which explains the election timeline. If you are interested in nominating yourself or another parent, please obtain a form from the office.

Do you hold a concession card? If so, you may be entitled to Camps, Sports & Excursion Funding.

The CSEF program for 2023 is now open until the 23 June 2023.

If are eligible you will receive \$125 per student that can be used to contribute to any costs relating to a camp, sporting activity or excursion your child attends. Payments are made directly to the school and are linked to the student. Unused funds are carried over each year.

If you have applied for CSEF previously, you do not need to apply again.

If you think you might be eligible, please complete the attached application form and return to the office with a copy of your concession card. Please refer to the attached flyer from the Department of Education for further information on eligibility.

If your Concession card is in your child's name, they are not eligible for this funding.

Walking School Bus

Kororoit Creek Primary School operates a Walking School Bus to promote active transport and to assist children to walk safely to and from school. The Walking School Bus is a bus that is powered by legs and is made up of at least 2 staff members. The bus walks along a set route picking up children at designated bus stops along the way.

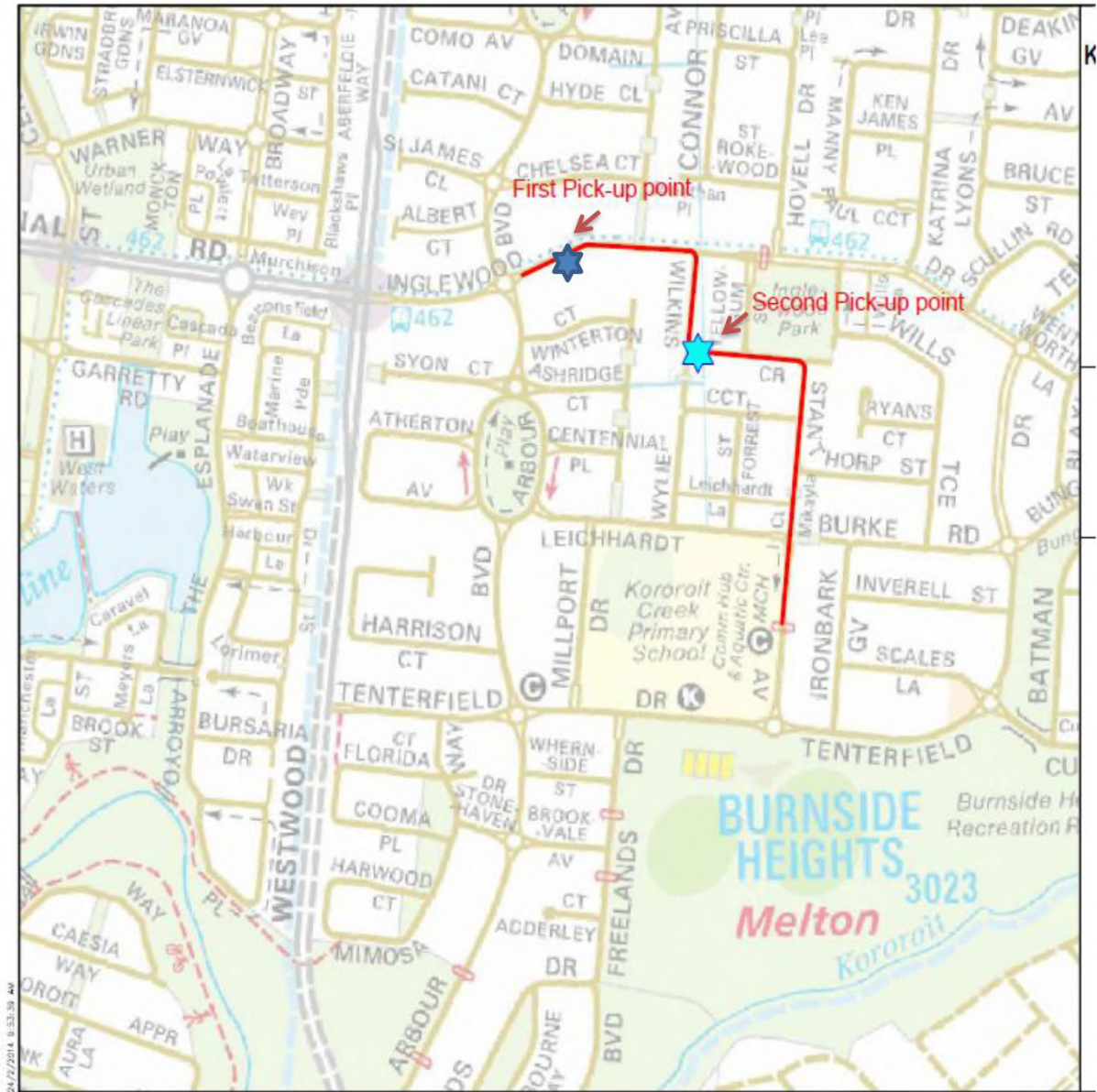
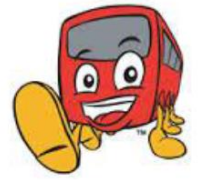

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- **new student enrolments;** your child has started or changed schools this year.
- **changed family circumstances;** such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.

CSEF ELIGIBILITY

Below are the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

Criteria 1 – General eligibility

To be eligible for the fund, a parent or carer of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- on the first day of Term one
- on the first day of Term two

- a) be a holder of one or more of the eligible financially-means tested cards **OR** be a temporary foster parent, and;
- b) submit an application to the school by the due date.

For the list of eligible financially-means tested cards refer to the CSEF Policy:

Parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with the above.

Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooled, or TAFE.

Special Consideration

A special consideration category exists for

- Families on a bridging visa, temporary protection visa, in community detention or are asylum seeker families
- Students in temporary out of home care arrangements, including statutory kinship care

Eligibility Date

For concession card holders CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/carer concession card being validated successfully with Centrelink on the first day of either term one (30 January 2023) or term two (24 April 2023).

PAYMENT AMOUNTS

CSEF payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

- Primary school student rate: \$125 per year.
- Secondary school student rate: \$225 per year.

The CSEF is paid directly to your child's school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.

For ungraded students, the rate payable is determined by the student's date of birth. For more information, see:

Year 7 government school students who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Secondary schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents/carers so please register your interest at the school.

1. Complete the PARENT/CARER DETAILS section.

Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.

If you are claiming as a temporary Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card to the school.
