▲ I will provide a further update on future works to assist with traffic flow and pedestrian safety around the school.


Kororoit Creek Primary School has a zero tolerance for any form of child abuse



Most schools are experiencing parking and traffic issues at pick up and drop off times. Through Melton and Brimbank Police have been out checking on driver behaviour around schools and school crossings.

It has become apparent that too many drivers are not obeying posted parking and speed signs.

It is important to park legally to provide a safer environment for children. Double parking restricts the view of drivers and forces children onto the road and obstructs traffic.



All school speed limits are clearly signposted. Remember the times and slow down around schools.

If you're unable to park legally close-by, please park a street or two away and walk to collect the children. It will also teach them about road safety.

Some of the fines include:

Exceeding speed limit by 10km/h but less than 25km/h - \$370 and 3 demerit points. Stopped – Double Parked or parked on Nature Strip- \$111 Fail to stop and remain stationary at children's crossing - \$462 and 3 demerit points. Use mobile phone while driving - \$555 and 4 demerit points.

Although the fines are significant the main focus of Police is the safety of the children and that of the crossing supervisors.

Please remember to be patient around schools. This will provide a safer environment for the children.

In your Compass events you will now be able to view the **Kororoit Creek Primary School Photographing and Filming notice.** This notice applies to photographs, video, audio, or any other recordings of students that are collected, used and disclosed by the school. The school is now taking an **opt out** approach to gaining parental consent. **If you do not wish to opt out, you do not need to do anything.**

Please read the attached consent form carefully to ensure you understand how photographing and filming students will work at Kororoit Creek Primary School. The consent form also contains a link to the Kororoit Creek Primary School Privacy Policy which aligns with the Department of Education Schools Privacy Policy. This can be accessed

If you choose to, you can opt out of photographing and filming permission at any time, but we ask that you do so this week if you haven't already as we intend to take photos at our upcoming school events. To opt out please direct your request in writing to the school email address: <u>kororoit.creek.ps@edumail.vic.gov.au</u> with your child's full name, year level and homeroom as the subject line.

If you are happy to have your child participate in the complete program at school you do not need to do anything, but we still encourage you to read the consent form.

Evidence shows that children who spend more time engaging in conversations with an adult develop better connections and problem-solving skills. At KCPS we are striving to give all of our students more opportunities to work in small groups and one on one situations so we can better cater to their individual needs.

This is where you come in!! We have big dreams about having a school filled with parent helpers again, supporting our students in classrooms, attending as guest speakers, helping on excursions and incursions and at wonderful events like our school picnic. We have tried to simplify the process for you to become registered to be a helper at the school.

On Compass you will now find a new event titled 'Parent Helper and OHS Induction'. This event is an opportunity for you to view a short online presentation and read through the KCPS OHS Induction booklet. Along with providing us with a Working with Children's Check and signing the OHS checklist, doing these things will allow you to be a parent helper at our school. The more people who do these things, the more adults we can have supporting our students.

So, we kindly ask that you go to the event on Compass, access the resources for the booklet and presentation, then click 'attending' on the event. Once you have done these things you can bring your Working with Children's Check to the office (if you haven't already) and let your child's teacher know when you are available. Note: whenever you are a parent helper at the school you will need to sign in at the office where they will require you to sign the OHS checklist on your first visit.


Grade 1


LET'S CELEBRATE OUR LEARNERS


















NUMERACY





2023 Numeracy

To continue to achieve our goals we have a lot of exciting things to focus on this year when it comes to **Numeracy @ KCPS.**

This year we will continue to work with our Numeracy Consultant Peter Sanders. He will have the opportunity to work with each of our year levels focusing on problem solving and making connections between the three strands of Numeracy.

Our School Improvement Team (SIT) will be working in coaching partnerships with a range of our staff members to build their teaching capacity around different teaching practices in Numeracy and how to support all of our Learners.

There will also be opportunities throughout the year for our learners to engage in FUN, authentic numeracy activities – for example International Day of Mathematics, STEAM night and the Australian Mathematics Competition.

2023 will be another busy yet exciting year, filled with new learning and great achievements.



PE


This week in Grade 5, students have been introduced to a new athletic event and are consolidating their knowledge of how different movements help them to perform in these athletic events. In preparation for the Athletics Carnival, students are working on improving their technique by practising their skills. They have been focussing on listening to and acting on feedback provided by the teacher and their fellow peers. Students have been showing the knowledgeable attribute by sharing their knowledge with their classmates. Students are working towards being inquirers who use a variety of strategies to improve and have been fantastic at trialling new ways to refine their technique.

ART

This week in Grade 1, students have been inquiring into the various ways paint can be manipulated to create an artwork. They have inquired into multiple paint types including ink, watercolour paint and acrylic paint and have explored how the paint types are different to one and other, as well as how using different tools to paint with such as bubble blowing, blowing with straws and mark making can change the outcome of the medium. Students will be working towards creating a collage artwork using their various painted artworks. We can't wait to see their final creations!!



In French, the Grade 4 students are working towards writing a letter to a penpal (who will be another Grade 4 student). Their letter comprises of 3 paragraphs; the first one being about themselves and the second one about their family members. This week, students are working on their last paragraph, where they are asking questions to get to know their penpals. This can be a little tricky as nouns in French have genders and it affects the way those questions are written.



MUSIC

This week, the Grade 5's have been collaborating within their ensemble groups to prepare for an in-house performance in Week 9. Students have chosen a 'just right' piece and have started the process of learning this piece using the knowledge, skills and strategies they have found out in previous lessons. Over the coming weeks, students will sort out this information in preparation for their performance as part of a formative assessment. Some of the pieces students have chosen are Batman, Jaws, Peppa Pig and Smoke on the Water, reading tablature notation on the guitar.
