



The Matrix

Recently, our school has introduced a new matrix which covers the right to learn, the right to be safe and the right to belong. ART

This term in art, the grade six students have been exploring different art styles including Pop Art and Street Art. They have been experimenting and developing their ability to layer and recreate artworks by famous artists. The grade six students have been demonstrating their ability to use skills of observation, to determine their material choices and techniques to achieve their desired outcome. Throughout the rest of the term, the students will use this knowledge to create their own Pop Art or Street Art themed artwork.

FRENCH



Last term, the grade three students learnt how to create a recipe to make a fruit salad. They started by learning the names of the fruits and described them using colours. Next, they created a recipe using conjunctions and action verbs. This made them understand how to make statements using imperative verb forms and vocabulary for ingredients and quantities. During this collaborative task, students were able to practice their French listening and pronunciation skills. At the end of the term, all grade three students were so

excited to make their own fruit salad that they tasted it together in the classroom during their French session.

MUSIC

Students in grade one have begun a new unit, where they will be inquiring into the central idea of 'Imagination inspires creation'. Students were provoked with various graphic score performances and explored what they could see, think and wonder. Students have explored drawing shapes to match sounds they hear using musical element language and have explored how instruments might match their drawing. The next step for grade one is to compile their knowledge to compose a graphic score of their own with musical elements language and perform on instruments.

PE

To kick start Term 3 in PE, students are refining and practising their teamwork skills through different team challenges. In grade five, students are learning how to work positively with others, share roles and responsibilities and communicate strengths and weaknesses to achieve success. Students have been working their way through different team challenges during an amazing race with their class. Each activity allows students to be thinkers who strategically plan ideas as a group to solve challenges. In the coming weeks, the grade five students will be exploring different invasion games which will require them to continue to utilise their teamwork skills in many different situations.
