### **Prep Enrolment**


If you would like to enrol your child into KCPS for Prep in




On Thursday, the 14th of September KCPS will be celebrating our annual Colour Run!



### **PYP Exhibition 2024**

In Week 4 of this term, our Grade 6 students embarked on their much-anticipated Exhibition journey. This extended inquiry is an opportunity for our students to display a culmination of the skills and dispositions that they have developed over time, in their journey through the Primary Years Programme.

This year our Grade 6 students are exploring and inquiring into the transdisciplinary theme: How We Express Ourselves. In the past few weeks our Grade 6 teachers have led students through unpacking the entire Programme of Inquiry and the various transdisciplinary themes and central ideas they have inquired into over the years. A highlight thus far has been the Excursion and Conference Days in Week 5.

During the Excursion Day students were involved in immersive and inspiring experiences at the Ian Potter Gallery, ACMI and Hosier Lane, all based on the How We Express Ourselves theme. Our Conference Day was equally as exciting with our exhibitionists engaging with Luke Kennedy, a motivational speaker, and a panel of artists that shared their creative processes.

We look forward to sharing the next phase of the Exhibition and wish all students well on their journey!




- Manisha was born in Nepal. She moved to Australia when she was 19 to study Computer Science.



### PE

As we move into the latter part of Term 3, our grade ones and twos have been learning how to correctly perform skills that we use in sports. This includes dribbling basketballs, dribbling soccer balls and accurately hitting targets by foot. As students have developed these skills, they have begun to link them with fundamental movement skills such as dribbling and running at the same time.

### ART

This term, the Grade Six students have been able to start their exhibition journey throughout all of their different subject areas. In art, students have been given the opportunity to reflect on important topics such as pollution and how to prevent it. They were given full ownership over which materials and techniques they would like to use in order to communicate a strong message to the community. This will then allow students to access ideas on how they could reuse and include these researches and inquiries into their own exhibition presentations.



## FRENCH

This term, the Grade Four students have been inquiring into the weather, by creating their own French weather forecast and presenting it to a small audience. They now know how to describe the weather in French using idioms and sayings as well as the names of the different types of weather. Students are also able to be precise in their descriptions by using the days of the week, numbers for temperatures and cardinal points when looking at a map of France.



## MUSIC

The Grade Five students have been inquiring into the central idea of, 'circumstance influences choice'. They have been exploring how different genres use and manipulate musical elements within the music. Students were provocated with questions, for example, what patterns and connections are you making? What is confusing or challenging for you? What questions do you have so far? This information was summarised to decide on next steps or point of need for them to successfully make music. This week, students have begun exploring beat sequencing and ostinato patterns on Garageband and will use these new skills and knowledge in their summative assessment.
