Some important reminders for the end of the year

A reminder about our new 2024 timings

As mentioned in previous newsletters and Compass posts, beginning next year we have made some changes to our bell times and how the school day will look at KCPS.

Key things to remember...

- The school day will begin at 8.50am, this means students should be in their classroom ready to learn at 8.50am.
- As we transition into this new schedule, our process for giving out late passes will stay the same for Term 1, we will only give out late passes for students that arrive after 9.00am.
- Lunchtime will be a longer break and will be the first break of the day.
- School dismissal time stays the same at 3.15pm.
- The yard will be supervised from 8.35am- students should not be dropped off at school before 8.35am.
- To support these changes, the canteen online ordering will close at 7.00am.
- These changes will only be implemented from the beginning of the 2024 school year.




iFly STEM Extension Excursion



On the 27th and 30th of November, the Grade 3 and 4 STEM extension students participated in an excursion to iFly. While they were there, they engaged in a STEM lab investigating the optimal design for a parachute. Through this process, they applied many 21st century skills including collaboration, creativity, communication and critical thinking. Designs were tested and their effectiveness was evaluated through a series of experiments. Students also had the opportunity to be risk takers and experience first-hand the effects of gravity and air resistance by taking flights. Those who dared to jump left with ear-to-ear grins, as all students built on their expanding knowledge in a unique and memorable STEM excursion.




Snapshot from Prep
