The Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge is open and Kororoit Creek Primary School is excited to be participating.



Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge

The Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge is now open and Kororoit Creek Primary School is excited to be participating. The PRC application offers a range of exciting features including:

- access to a library catalogue (including book images and blurbs)
- · a modern user-friendly interface
- · rewarding students with badges as challenge milestones are achieved
- the option for students to mark books as a favourite, give them a star rating or complete a book review

The Challenge is open to all Victorian children from birth to Year 10 in recognition of the importance of reading for literacy development. It is not a competition; but a personal challenge for children to read a set number of books by 6 September 2024.

Children from Prep to Year 2 are encouraged to read or 'experience' 30 books with their parents and teachers. Children from Year 3 to Year 10 are challenged to read 15 books.

All children who meet the Challenge will receive a certificate of achievement signed by the Victorian Premier and former Premiers.

Mental Health in Primary Schools Recognising when your child needs support

Like all of us, children can feel sad, angry and upset at times. Knowing that these feelings are normal can be helpful.

However, if your child feels like this a lot or most of the time, or has difficulty coping, getting on with others, or doing their usual activities, it's a sign they may need help.

Letting your child know that you care for them and are ready to listen and help is a great first step.

You don't have to manage these concerns on your own. There's a range of supports available through your child's school and within your community.

If you're concerned about your child's wellbeing:

- Reach out to your child's classroom teacher. Following this, the teacher may
 contact the year level Assistant Principal for further support. Moving forward, if
 they begin to notice the same concerns, the classroom teacher may make
 an internal mental health referral.
 - Call Parentline on 13 22 89 for telephone counselling services.
- Make an appointment for your child at the GP to make a mental health care plan and seek further advice.

Hi everyone, it feels really great to be working at KCPS. A little about me, I completed my Masters of Social Work a couple of years ago and spent time working up in Alice Springs. I then moved back to Melbourne and worked within the Department of Education in the region as a Social Worker before starting at KCPS as a Social Worker, also providing counselling. Outside of work, I love to be in nature going camping, hiking, skiing and growing veggies in my vegetable garden. I'm thinking of ways

to incorporate nature into my counselling work here at KCPS as I believe the outdoors can really help in the counselling process.



MUSIC The prep students have been inquiring into how imagination can inspire creation. They have been exploring how to compose music to show animal features such as the long neck of a Giraffe. Throughout this term, students drew their favourite animal and annotated their drawing with an instrument rhythm, dynamics and tempo to match. Following this they performed their composition matching the information from their drawings.




PE

Students in grades five and six have been exploring the invasion games unit. Throughout the term students have been rotating through a range of games and activities that focus on the skills and tactics required to be successful. Some of these include invading the opposition's space, defending your own team's space, and collaborating and devising plans through constructive communication. Once students have developed the fundamentals of invasion games, they can then transfer these skills into the sports which have been explored in Basketball, Soccer and American Football.

FRENCH

This term, grade 5 students have been exposed to a French cartoon (Boule et Bill) and learnt a few common French phrases. They thought of a main character and introduced it, before creating a storyboard to plan their story. They constructed simple sentences such as "je veux manger" (I want to eat) and "je peux gagner" (I can win). They also incorporated a few onomatopoeias and used their storyboard in order to create their comic strip. Keep it up!



ART

In art this term, the grade five students have been inquiring into mixed media. They have been exploring pop up art and experimenting with the process of layering as well as discovering ways that they can use their prior knowledge of paper manipulation in order to elevate their 3D artwork. Students have been getting creative with lots of different materials such as paint, tissue paper, beads, buttons and pastels to create their final artwork with a focus of their choice, ensuring they have implemented their new found knowledge of pop art artworks. We are excited to see the final outcome our grade five students create!


