





Aaghneyan and Eve and all of H39 did a phenomenal job on their writing last week.



MUSIC

The grade two students have been inquiring into 'Imagination Inspires Creation', where they have explored a range of graphic scores and analysed how pictures/graphics can represent sounds/music. Using a stimulus of a silent cartoon video, students have begun creating their own graphic scores to represent the music that matches the visual. Within their graphic scores, students composed their music based on an emotion and musical elements to match. Working towards the end of the unit, students will practise using their graphic scores to perform their music in time with the silent film.



PE

Recently, students in Grade Prep and One have been practising and using their fundamental motor skills within different sports. They have had a focus on using skills such as passing, catching and striking to help them achieve success within a team and as an individual. Students in Grade Six have been rotating through various Net sports such as Volleystars, Spike Ball and Badminton. Net sports hold significant value, fostering teamwork, coordination, and sportsmanship. These sports not only hone skills but also instill the importance of collaboration and fair play among students. They have had a great focus on applying tactics and strategies within their gameplay to achieve success.

FRENCH Bonjour. With all the excitement surrounding the Olympics, our Prep students have been learning French words celebrating success. Words like 'bravo' (fantastic), 'Félicitations' (congratulations), 'Merci' (thank you), 'De rien' (well done) and other appropriate words. The students have been learning numbers in French as well. They can identify the colours of the Olympic rings in French and have hopefully seen some Olympic footage and recognised French icons, most notably, the Eiffel Tower.



ART Our Grade Four students have been transforming simple plasticine into vibrant, animal themed pots that showcase their creativity and skill. They have been using various sculpting and manipulating techniques including rolling, flattening and pinching to shape the plasticine into shark pots which, of course, included fins and teeth. As students moulded their pots, they not only practiced their artistic abilities but also learned about texture and form. Over the term, students will be creating an animal themed pot using clay which will reflect their individual artistic talents and highlight the value of hands on, creative learning experiences in fostering skill development and self expression.

There is one scholarship available in each category at each junior campus:

The College looks for exemplary young people who are exceptional in different areas and possess personal qualities and values that will contribute to the life of Copperfield College.

Copperfield College Scholarship Program recognises the considerable achievements of children in our community and provides them with the opportunity to experience exciting curriculum opportunities through a broad range of engaging programs delivered by our dedicated teachers.

Scholarships are awarded for two years commencing in Year 7 and then reviewed going into year 8. Scholarship recipients will be Grade 6 students who will be attending Copperfield College in Year 7 the following year.

Community (Good Citizenship) Scholarships are available to students who have made a significant demonstrable contribution to their community. The successful applicant(s) will display a strong social conscience as well as an outstanding work ethic and behaviour.

Sporting Excellence Scholarships are available to keen sports persons who have shown outstanding aptitude and personal achievement in one or many sporting field(s).

The Arts Scholarships are available to students who have displayed excellence and shown commitment in one or more of the Arts (such as; Drama, Music, Dance, Visual Arts). Successful applicants should have a record of involvement in all aspects of primary school life in addition to artistic talent.
