I hope everyone had a relaxing holiday break and students are feeling rested and ready for a big Term 4. The end of Term 3 was a busy one for us at KCPS! There was lots happening from our school review to our PYP Evaluation and it was a hectic end to the term, I know the holidays came at a good time.

Works over the holidays

You may have noticed that some work has been completed over the holidays. We now have a new path leading to the oval, and the garden beds in the area between H01-H02 and H26-H27 have been extended to prevent students running through the gate in that area. We will be reminding students to not run through the garden beds. We are also very excited to have had a new cricket pitch installed for our students.

2024 School Review

We had a wonderful review experience; the panel was able to really dig deep into our work at KCPS and determine some authentic next steps for us as a school community. It was a wonderful chance to celebrate some of the amazing things that we do at the school.

Our external panel members were blown away by our students and how they were able to speak to their learning as well as our wellbeing programs such as Attributes in Action. During classroom observations, all panel members commented on how settled and engaged our students were and how evident it is that there is a strong focus on academic success as well as balancing the importance of student wellbeing.

Thank-you to everyone who was a part of our school review and made is such a success from completing surveys or attending parent focus groups, all input was highly valued and ensured we had a really thorough review which resulted in a rich Strategic Plan for the next four years. Thank-you! I look forward to sharing our new Strategic Plan with the school community once it has been finalised.

PYP Evaluation

As if the end of Term 3 wasn't busy enough, we ended the final week with our PYP Evaluation visit. This visit was completed online by two IB evaluators who reviewed all of our documentation and evidence and then met with our students, staff and parents to discuss how we are implementing the IB PYP Programme.

Once again, this was a really positive visit and the evaluators were extremely complimentary of how we adapt the PYP framework within a Victorian Government school setting. They were very impressed with how our students were able to speak about the Learner Profile as well as their Units of Inquiry. They commented that our staff are highly skilled in teaching the PYP and this was evident through discussions with both teachers themselves, students and filmed lesson observations.

An area of focus for us moving forward is to ensure that we continue to educate our parent community on the Primary Years Programme to ensure that our families are familiar with the programme and feel connected to your child's learning. We look forward to receiving the official report over the coming weeks which I will share with the community.

I would like to thank everyone again who was a part of this evaluation, especially Drita Demiri our PYP Coordinator. There was a lot of work that went into the preparation and organisation of the visit. Thank-you!

Parent Requests for 2025 homerooms

As we are heading into the end of the year, we are starting to plan for 2025 and I would like to take this opportunity to address an important aspect of our school's philosophy. One of the fundamental principles that guides our approach at KCPS is our commitment to providing a well-rounded and inclusive experience for every student and we firmly believe that each child's academic growth and wellbeing is nurtured best when we make thoughtful and considered decisions regarding their grade placement.

I understand that as parents you may have specific requests and preferences regarding your child's future classes and friends, however, while we value your involvement, I want to emphasise the importance of trusting our dedicated teachers to make the right decisions about what's best for their students and their learning. With this in mind, I would like to inform you that we will not be accepting any parent requests for grade placements including friends you would like them to be paired with or alternatively, separated from. There are many factors that are considered when building grades from gender, academic achievements, friendships, behaviour considerations- it is a very thorough and complex process. I firmly believe that our teachers are best equipped to make these decisions, knowing their students, how they learn and their social interactions.

Our Assistant Principals will also be supporting with the process and will be able to provide an extra level of detail and consideration of historical requests and events.

Please remember, teachers always want what is best for their students so will be making these decisions with a great deal of thought and consideration. We still encourage you to maintain an open line of communication with your child's teacher and with our Assistant Principals.

Later in the term, as always, students will have an opportunity to nominate five friends that they would like to be placed with and will be guaranteed to be placed with at least one of those friends in their 2025 class. We will also be having our Step Up Day at the end of the year where students have an opportunity to meet their new teacher and their new class.

If you have any concerns, please reach out to either me or one of the Assistant Principals. I thank-you again for trusting us with this process.

Lead the Way Psychology & Animal-Assisted Therapy

INFORMATION SHEET

INFECTION CONTROL - STAYING HEALTHY WHEN VISITING WITH DOGS

What we do:

We ensure our visiting, therapy and school dogs are as happy and healthy as possible. They are always up to date with their vaccinations and preventative health care, including parasite treatments (such as fleas and worms)

What you can do:

There are some things that you can do to help keep yourself healthy around the dogs too;

- Always wash your hands before and after visiting, especially before preparing or eating food. You can take advantage of the hand sanitisers provided, until you can get to a tap with running water and soap.
- Dogs can carry germs inside their mouths and bottoms, so:
 - o Don't let the dogs lick your face or mouth
 - Don't put your hands in your mouth, eyes or nose after visiting the dog
 - Don't touch the inside of the dog's mouth, or under their tail
 - Wash your hands after touching the dog, playing with the dog's toys, or feeding the dog

Let us know:

If your immune system is struggling (for example you're on Chemotherapy or are HIV positive), you're very unwell, or you're pregnant, please let our team know, so we can take extra care to help protect you.


