Classes that have consistently demonstrated these behaviours have been recognised with shout-outs and AiA points!



MUSIC

This week in music, Grade 3 students have been learning to compose music to match a Minecraft biome. First, students were explicitly introduced to the structure of major and minor chords and learnt about the difference in tonality (happy and sad sounds). Next, they explored how to play these chords on a glockenspiel. They learnt how to form simple ostinato (repeated) patterns using a chord of their choice to match the emotion of their biome. Along with this, students created rhythms on instruments such as the djembe, clave and egg shaker. At the end of the lesson students shared their creations to the class.

ART


This term, Grade 1 students have been exploring abstract art. They have been learning the fundamentals of abstract art and how to create it by using the concepts of lines, shapes and colour. Students have also been exposed to different types of abstract art such as paintings from Hilma Klint or the Miro. This week, Grade 1s have dived deeper into the art of Miro by playing the 'roll a Miro' board game that allowed them to create randomised Miro creatures that linked to the 'automatic drawing' technique used by Miro. We cannot wait to see all the beautiful artworks they will keep creating this term!

PE


The Grade 6 students have started their exhibition inquiries. Students created a Word Cloud of issues they have faced in sports within school and the wider community. The Word Cloud demonstrated the top three issues that the students may have come across. The top three issues will be explored further within their P.E lessons to develop a deeper understanding and to possibly take action. Alongside exhibition, students are participating in the CEPEP program, where they choose roles and responsibilities to run a successful sport event. Some of the roles and responsibilities include; captain, timekeeper, scorer, media or coach.

FRENCH

This term, the Grade 5 students are pretending to be celebrities and are working towards having an interview. They have started their draft by introducing themselves as well as sharing their likes and dislikes. Then, they have described their physical appearance such as describing their eye and hair colour. They are currently working on drafting their interview questions. Students have engaged in games such as wordwall and kahoot to prepare themselves to write their sentences. Keep it up!

MUSIC

The Grade Four students have been exploring how a film score and Foley sounds enhance movies and engage the viewer. They have explored how the musical elements can communicate an emotion or feeling within a film to reinforce the moving image. Using a cartoon video clip with the sound removed, students planned their ideas for the film score identifying which musical elements they would like to use to show the feeling of each scene and included Foley sounds to accentuate the actions. Throughout this unit, students have developed a range of iPad skills using GarageBand, iMovie and Google Classroom to create their projects.

ART

This term, the Prep students have been investigating painting. To begin the unit, they explored how to mix primary into secondary colours and created a turtle colour wheel. They then looked into the difference between watercolour and acrylic paints, and explored different mark making techniques using combs, forks and bottle cap lids. The students are now using this knowledge to create their own painted fan artwork. We are very excited to see their finished artworks!



PE

Congratulations to the boys that participated in the District Basketball tournament. The team played four games against different schools in grouping A, losing only one game for the whole day. Our team ended up placing second on the grouping ladder and played a final game against the second placing team in grouping B which they won! The boys should be proud of their efforts with attending all training sessions and playing well on the day.



FRENCH

In Grade 1, students have been working on describing themselves using adjectives. They have also engaged in activities such as pictionary and memory cards in order to learn the vocabulary for different toys. Then, they used their knowledge of 'j'aime' (I like) and 'je n'aime pas' (I do not like) in order to share with others what toys they like and do not like. They have published a puzzle representation of themselves that includes all the information. Great work, Grade 1!

R U OK? Day

It can be difficult to manage various peer-to-peer situations that arise in the school day. The link below contains an interactive video that invites primary school students, supported by a trusted adult, to 'choose their own journey' while navigating feelings and choices during R U OK? conversations. Students will learn personal and social skills and increase their confidence to be able to have an R U OK? conversation with a friend. Simply pause the video at decision points to discuss the appropriate action.


School Holiday activities




