2026 Grade Placement

As we are heading into the end of the year and we are starting to plan for 2026, I would like to take this opportunity to address an important aspect of our school's philosophy. One of the fundamental principles that guides our approach at KCPS is our commitment to providing a well-rounded and inclusive experience for every student and we firmly believe that each child's academic growth and wellbeing is nurtured best when we make thoughtful and considered decisions regarding their grade placement.

I understand that as parents you may have specific requests and preferences regarding your child's future classes and friends, however, while we value your involvement, I want to emphasise the importance of trusting our dedicated teachers to make the right decisions about what's best for their students and their learning. With this in mind, I would like to inform you that **we will not be accepting any parent requests** for grade placements including friends you would like them to be paired with or alternatively, separated from. There are many factors that are considered when building grades from gender, academic achievements, friendships, behaviour considerations- it is a very thorough and complex process. I firmly believe that our teachers are best equipped to make these decisions, knowing their students, how they learn and their social interactions.

Our Assistant Principals will also be supporting with the process and will be able to provide an extra level of detail and consideration of historical requests and events. Please remember, teachers always want what is best for their students so will be making these decisions with a great deal of thought and consideration. We still encourage you to maintain an open line of communication with your child's teacher and with our Assistant Principals.

Later in the term, as always, students will have an opportunity to nominate five friends that they would like to be placed with and will be guaranteed to be placed with at least one of those friends in their 2026 class. We will also be having our Step Up Day at the end of the year where students have an opportunity to meet their new teacher and their new class.

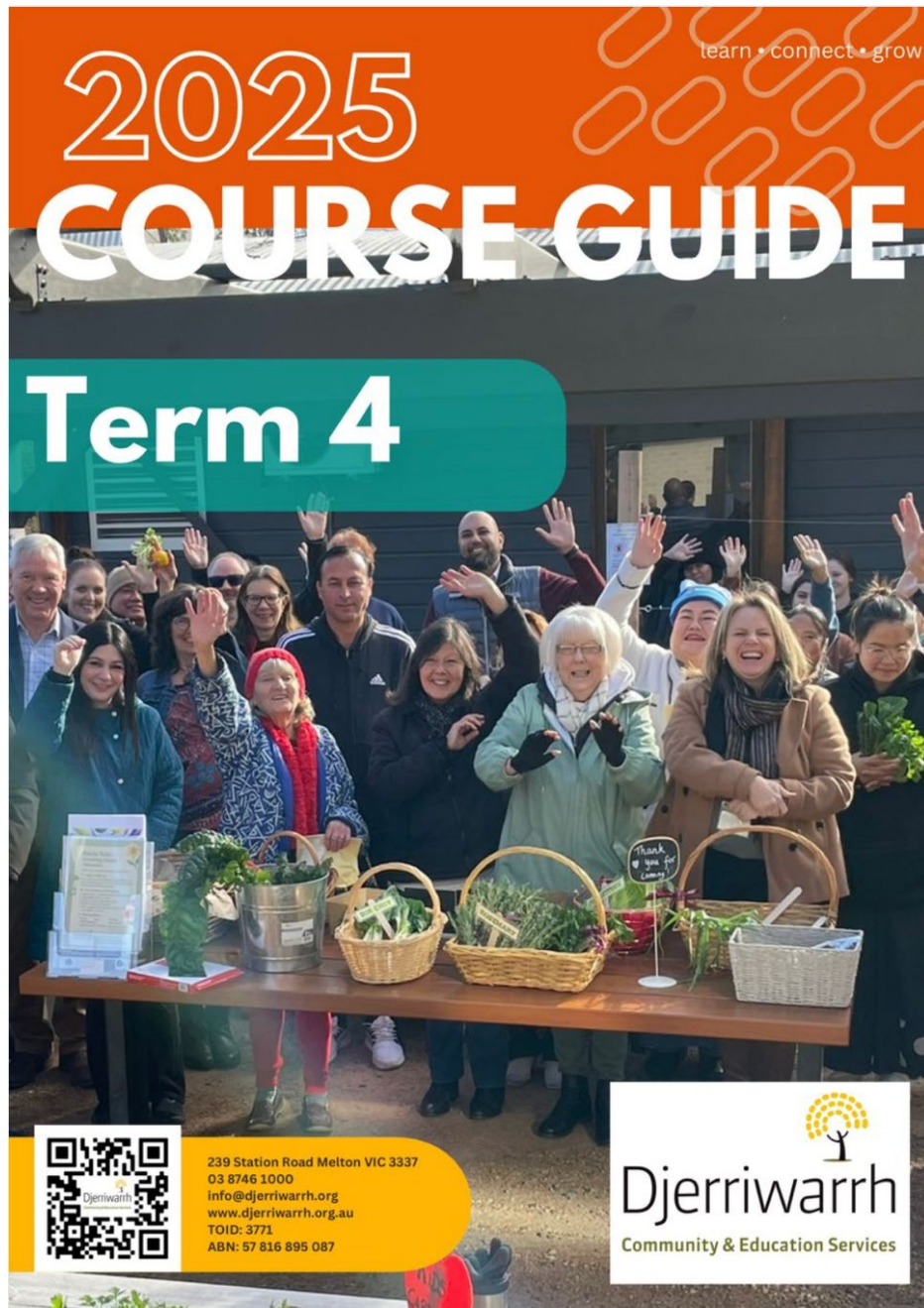

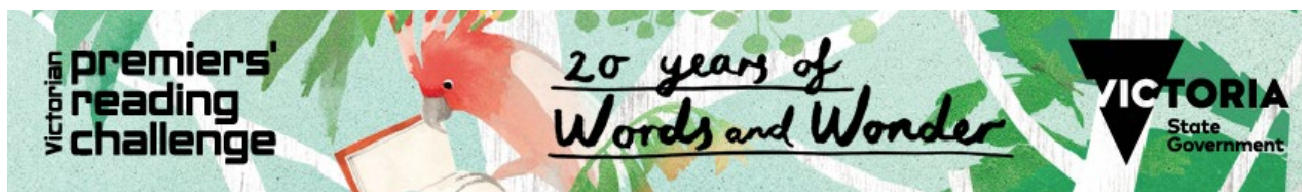

Congratulations to our students who completed the challenge!

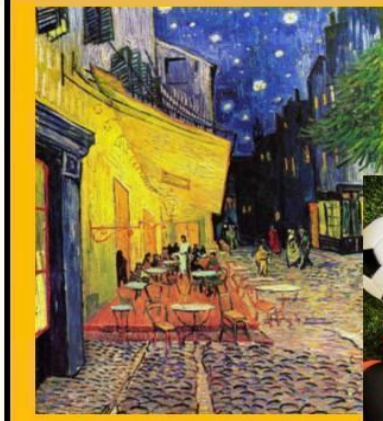

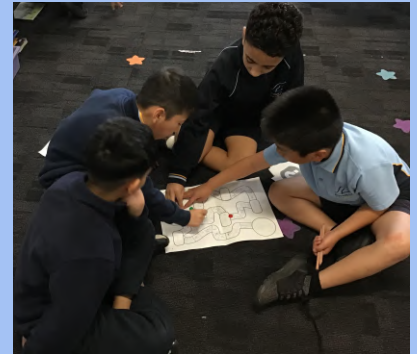
Specialist News

FRENCH

The Grade 3 students have been working towards creating a board game. Throughout the unit, they have engaged in various games such as pictionary, memory cards and charades in order to learn the vocabulary about vehicles and emotions. They followed the steps instructed, in order to create sentences for their action cards. In groups, the students designed their board games. At the end of the unit, the students were able to use their action cards and play their board game.



PE

The Grade 3 and 4 students have been learning and playing a range of invasion sports, including games like soccer, basketball, and netball. Throughout the unit, they explored the key concepts of teamwork and strategy, focusing on the importance of both attacking and defending roles within a team. Students learned how to create scoring opportunities by moving into and invading empty spaces, while also developing their ability to defend and regain possession. Their growing understanding of these roles has helped them improve their game awareness, communication, and ability to work together effectively during competitive and cooperative activities.

ART

This week in Art, our Prep students began exploring the wonderful world of plasticine! In their first session, they learned how to manipulate the material by rolling, pinching, flattening and joining pieces together. These hands-on techniques are helping to build fine motor skills while encouraging creativity and play. The students enjoyed experimenting with different shapes and textures, and this learning will lead into future work with clay, where they will be able to create more detailed and lasting artworks.

MUSIC

The Grade 5 students are busy preparing their repertoire for an upcoming performance as part of Music Week in Week 4. They have been reviewing their prior knowledge of pieces learned over the course of the year in both group and solo settings and selecting an appropriate repertoire for this performance. Through the selection process, they have identified particular ensemble parts on guitar, drums, djembe, keyboard and xylophone which are best suited to their level of ability and engagement. They have also reviewed their knowledge of performance skills and working as a team in order to prepare their pieces to parents, families and friends.
