Resilience in primary aged students

In the previous newsletter and on Compass, information started to be shared regarding how children can be supported to develop resilience. This fortnight, we are continuing the discussion with a new suggestion listed below.

Resilience building suggestion #3: Family members sharing personal stories of times challenges have been overcome.

- *Encourage family members to share stories during dinner time or while travelling together in the car.*
- *Create a "family story night" where each person shares a time they showed courage, persistence, or resilience.*
- *Use bedtime conversations as an opportunity to reflect on challenges and positive ways to handle them.*
- *Invite children to ask questions about how family members felt during difficult times and what helped them through.*
- *Encourage children to draw or write about a challenge they have overcome and discuss it together as a family.*
- *Talk openly about small everyday challenges to help children understand that resilience can be built over time.*

WHOLE SCHOOL EXPECTATIONS



EXITING THE CLASSROOM



Our whole school has focused on building clear expectations for how students exit the classroom before break times and at the end of the day.

Students have been practising:

- lining up at the door with a partner
- wearing hats when going outside to play
 - remaining silent while in line
- walking out the door in an orderly and calm manner
- waiting for the teacher to dismiss them, rather than the bell

It has been wonderful to see so many students following these expectations when exiting the classroom and contributing to a safe and respectful school environment.

Classes that have consistently demonstrated these behaviours have been recognised with shout-outs and AiA points!





Specialist News



MUSIC In Music this term, our Grade 3 students have been developing their skills in being performance ready. They began by exploring the purpose of a count-in, learning how it helps musicians know when to start and the tempo (speed) to play. Students then used a metronome to maintain a steady beat, ensuring their playing stayed consistent throughout a piece. They also focused on developing their guitar technique, practising how to produce clear notes by placing their fingers close to the fret and applying appropriate pressure. These skills are all building towards our annual Music Week performances in Week 5, and we look forward to showcasing their hard work.

ART In art, the Grade 6 students have been inquiring into pop art. They have explored the arts elements that make up a pop art artwork and used this to inspire their very own 'Is it cake?' artwork with the choice of making either a piece of cake, burger or sandwich. Students have begun constructing the base of their artworks using measurement to help them create accurate shapes. They have practiced manipulating cardboard to make it soft and easier to gain their required shape. Once their bases are complete students will then use mixed media to add further features to their final food creation.



STEM

In Grade 6, students have been using the micro:bit to explore coding and physical computing. They have created digital name badges, displayed text and personalised their devices. Students programmed the buttons to show happy and sad faces, helping them understand how inputs control outputs. They also explored the micro:bit's motion sensor by coding it to generate a random number when shaken. Through these engaging, hands on activities, students are developing their problem solving, creativity and computational thinking skills.

PE

Students in Grades 3–6 recently took part in our annual Cross Country event, showcasing their determination, resilience and great sportsmanship. It was fantastic to see so many students challenging themselves, supporting their peers and giving their best effort across all races. The atmosphere was positive and encouraging, with students demonstrating our school values throughout the day. Congratulations to all participants for their effort and enthusiasm, and a special mention to those who placed in their races. Thank you to staff and families for their support in making the event such a success.
