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Specialist News



MUSIC

In Music, Grade 2 students have been exploring how sounds and music can be created in different ways. Students began by creating rhythmic patterns using a variety of body percussion techniques, including clapping, patting, finger clicking, and stomping. They then considered which classroom instruments could best represent these sounds and worked collaboratively with a partner to rehearse and perform their compositions. As part of this learning, students investigated ways to record and communicate musical ideas through graphic notation, using shapes, symbols, and visual representations to document their rhythmic patterns. This has helped students develop an understanding of how music can be represented beyond traditional notation. In the coming weeks, students will build on these skills by creating more complex compositions featuring multiple rhythmic parts and a range of instruments, further developing their creativity, collaboration, and musical understanding.

ART

This term, Prep students have been exploring different ways of making art by using different techniques and materials. They practised ripping and cutting coloured paper in order to create different artworks, and had a go at using PVA glue to add various materials to their work. Their final artwork was to create an animal of their choice using their knowledge of shapes and lines, and adding materials that would best suit their animal, such as feathers for a bird, match sticks for spiky fur, and so on.



STEM

In STEM, Year 3 students have been developing their coding and collaboration skills using Sphero robots. Working with a partner, students created and tested code to guide their Sphero to specific targets, navigate around obstacles and travel in different geometric shapes. Throughout these challenges, students applied computational thinking skills such as planning, sequencing, predicting, testing and debugging. It has been fantastic to see students communicate effectively, solve problems together and show persistence as they refined their programs to achieve success.

PE

The Grade 5 and 6 students have been building on their knowledge and skills for invasion sports. The sports that the students have covered are Basketball, Soccer and Ultimate Frisbee. When learning a sport, students will develop and practise the skills needed for each particular sport first, then use these skills in drills and exercise, in mini/modified games and finally in full games. In the Invasion Sports, students have practised skills such as, dribbling the ball, different passing and catching techniques, footwork, defensive skills and movement to space either to receive the ball or create space to keep possession.
